The ONE Action campaign is focused on bringing awareness and support to women in Nova Scotia with disabilities that face domestic violence.

ONE Person

Women with disabilities in domestic violence situations **are vulnerable**. They are often physically, socially and geographically isolated, and may be wholly dependent on their caregiver.



One person can learn to recognize the signs of abuse.

ONE change

The **current networks and systems of support** in the community, may not always meet the needs of women with disabilities.



Women with disabilities have rights. Those rights need to be a priority. Removing barriers to accessibility will improve the lives of all women.

ONE Action

Actions to **reach women in their own communities** and circumstances with a combination of public advocacy; development of safe, accessible spaces, accessibility education and training.



Each of these actions is a step toward a **better future – from surviving to thriving**.



Actions that will support women with disabilities that experience domestic violence.

Every action toward accessibility matters. Even taking one action in support of women with disabilities that face domestic violence can make a positive impact.

Accessibility Audits

Complete accessibility audits of transition houses and women's resources centres in Nova Scotia.

Community Leadership

Work with local governments and community organizations to remove barriers and create safe spaces.

Homecare

Explore continuity in home care so that women with disabilities receive the care they need in the location they are in, safely, securely, and with dignity.

Culturally Responsive Care Work

Identify and remove accessibility barriers for Black, Indigenous, and other racialized women with disabilities.



Education and Training

Provide training for police and other frontline service workers on how to help women with disabilities who experienced domestic violence.

Navigation and Outreach

Ensure women with disabilities have support navigating systems and accessing the supports they need.

Accessible Housing

Build more affordable, accessible housing
